SATURDAY 19TH JUNE 2010

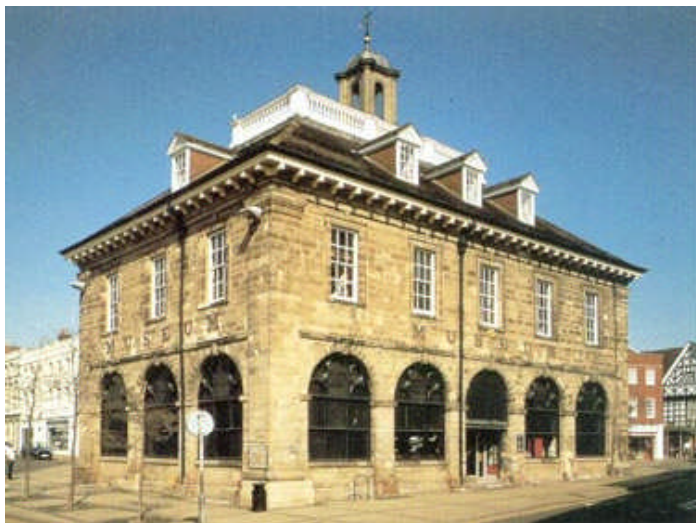
Our outing on 19 June will be to Charlecote Park in Warwickshire, home to the Lucy Family since the 15th century although they acquired the land back in 1247.

It is situated in beautiful parkland 'inspired' by Capability Brown, overlooking the river Avon. There has been a herd of fallow deer here since Tudor times but the story that William Shakespeare poached here is thought to be untrue! Queen Elizabeth I stayed here, but I feel it must beg the question as to where didn't she stay, as she does seem to have got around a bit!



Charlecote Park

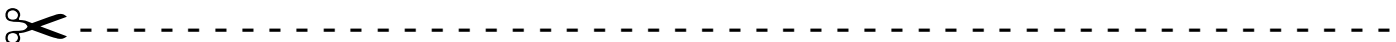
